CONSTITUTION

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1. Name

The name of the association is The Stronghold Gaming Club Inc.

2. Objectives

- Unite and support gaming and role-playing communities across Australia through collaboration, shared resources, and inclusive practices.
- Promote the creative, educational, and social benefits of role-playing games (RPGs) and related events.
- Provide centralised platforms for game tracking, resource sharing, event promotion, and safe community interaction.
- Support game organisers with administrative tools, technical support, and visibility within the broader role-playing network.
- Offer discounts, benefits, and opportunities to members through sponsorships, partnerships, and community initiatives.
- Ensure all activities are inclusive, non-discriminatory, and conducted with the highest standards of safety, fairness, and respect.

3. Membership

Membership is open to individuals and organisations that support the objectives of the association. Members must be at least 16 years of age.

There are four tiers of membership:

- Tier 1 – Initiate of the Stronghold (\$0 annually): Includes voting rights and access to the community and tools.
- Tier 2 – Citizen of the Stronghold (\$10 annually): Includes all Tier 1 benefits plus access to member-exclusive community forums, resources, tools and discounts.
- Tier 3 - Defender of the Stronghold (\$25 annually): Includes all Tier 2 benefits plus eligibility to nominate or serve in the Committee, priority access to events, recognition on the Discord server.
- Tier 4 - Champion of the Stronghold (\$50 annually): Include all Tier 3 benefits plus further discounts with Stronghold sponsors and partners, VIP access to events, Physical Merchandise, exclusive access to the Stronghold TTRPG Library resource.

4. Committee

The committee shall comprise a President, Secretary, Treasurer, and up to six additional members, making a maximum of nine committee members. Committee members shall serve a term of two years. The committee is responsible for the management and administration of the association.

5. Voting

Each member is entitled to one vote. Proxy voting is permitted in accordance with the association's procedures and requires a completed proxy form submitted prior to the meeting.

6. Meetings

The association shall hold an Annual General Meeting (AGM) at least once every calendar year. A quorum, as defined in the association's rules, is required for the conduct of any meeting.

7. Finances

Membership fees are required to maintain active membership status. The committee may adjust membership fees as necessary, with notification provided to members in advance. All funds must be applied solely to further the objectives of the association and must not be used for private gain.

8. Dispute Resolution

Any disputes arising between members or between members and the committee shall first be addressed through internal mediation processes before referral to external dispute resolution mechanisms.

9. Winding Up

In the event the association is wound up, any remaining assets shall be transferred to another not-for-profit organisation with similar objectives. No part of the association's assets or income shall be distributed to members.
